Welcome to your November Horizons! This month we have some important celebrations and ceremonies to recognize. November 8th is National Indigenous Veterans Day, a day of remembrance and commemoration of the contributions of Indigenous veterans in the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Korean War. This Indigenous Veterans Day, we would like to express our gratitude for the contributions Indigenous veterans have made to Canada and the world. On November 11 I will lay our local's wreath at Ladner Memorial Park in honor of Canadian soldiers who fought for peace and for those who continue to wish for peace across Canada and the world. If you have the time please join me and the Delta community at the cenotaph at Memorial Park. The ceremony starts at 11am but best to arrive by 10:30 for a good spot. November 12th is the Celebrations of Diwali for Hindu, Punjabi, Jain, and Buddhist members. May this Diwali bring light, happiness, and prosperity to all who celebrate, and may it symbolise the victory of good over evil and the triumph of knowledge over ignorance.

From October 21 to 28 I had the pleasure of attending the 60th Annual CUPE National Convention in Quebec City, Quebec with local delegates Deborah Kabesh, Rosey Hussein, and Kim Barnes. It was six full days of CUPE activism, solidarity, education with many resolutions and some constitutional changes coming to the convention floor. We had guest speakers from Haiti and Cuba, NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh, and many others all speaking of the strength of unions for working people. CUPE is the largest union in Canada with over 496,000 members!!! Although there was a lot of CUPE business it was also a time to reflect on who we are as a Nation and how we can work together to strengthen our union on shared concerns including wages and safe working conditions. It was a pleasure to be from BC being able to share from YOUR K-12 Sector at the last round of bargaining you received 14.4% over 3 years! It was a huge accomplishment for Canadians to hear! I was extremely proud to be from BC, to have sat on the K-12 presidents council bargaining committee and accomplish this unprecedented agreement in Canada for all of you.

On November 2nd at ND your executive met with the CUPE Site Reps and Shop Stewards to provide training and a pizza dinner. It was great to see so many of you out! We explained the difference between CUPE Site Reps and Shop Stewards. CUPE Site Reps can help answer questions about your contract, benefits, vacation, sick time and other collective agreement matters and their work. The Site Rep can advocate for members at the worksite. They are your connection to your union office, union president, lead shop steward, shop stewards, and executive. We asked that all site reps reach out to Lead Shop Steward Kim Barnes if you are asked to attend meetings with your supervisor or the employer, or for anything you need help with. In this issue of *Horizons* you will find your local Bylaw language for Site Reps. Duties of a Shop Steward will be covered in December's issue.

Also this year, your executive decided to discontinue site binders with paper resources. Instead we have moved all information onto your website. Go to www.cupe1091.ca to find all resources you need. Your site reps have been trained on where to find what you need. Reach out to them if you need help!

The duties are to be the support person – someone members can contact for question about the local's contract, benefits, vacation, sick time and other collective agreement matters and their work. The Site Rep can advocate for members at the worksite. They are your connection to your union office, union president, lead shop steward, shop stewards and executive. CUPE Site Reps are not Shop Stewards and cannot represent members at any meetings with administrators or management. Site Reps can advocate for members and are the first contact person if members need help or support.

Celebrating Diwali



What is a "Triad Committee"?

Last year during discussions with your employer, the teacher's union, and through the Employee Wellness Committee, we knew that there was work to do so that our members would feel a sense of safety and belonging and trust when there was a reason to come to their administrators and/or supervisors on concerns at work. Your 2nd VP, Mirjam Vandop, and I worked together with the Superintendents, HR and the Delta Teachers Union to design TRIAD Committees for this purpose. CUPE prepared and provided training over several sessions at the beginning of the school year.

TRIAD means one Principal or Manager, one CUPE member (usually the site rep), and one member from the DTA at each site. Mirjam and I looked forward to every meeting to prepare to do this important work. We had members from every single school or worksite step up to be a CUPE rep and attend the TRIAD training at DMEC. Thank you to every one of you who came out—this work will help ensure the success of all of us!

The training's focus was on learning about how to work as a team as equal leaders to support each other at every school and/or worksite. The CUPE Site Rep list has been sent out to all members. We encourage each of you to please reach out to your site rep if you need any help at work. When you do, the site rep will reach out to your union. We are always here in any way and we need and want you to know that your employer must provide a psychologically safe work space as required by WorkSafeBC Guidelines. We are all learning together and I am extremely appreciative of the work the design team did together to support and guide us in starting conversations to build trust, provide a safe space, and a shared sense of belonging for the best of your employment.
