Health and Safety has been a real focus for Leigh Bartlett your Occupational Health & Safety 3rd Vice President on the executive. Leigh spent the summer taking numerous courses to be prepared for this school year and her vital role as our CUPE Health and Safety Officer. We have had a significant amount of members who have been exposed to hazardous materials and have submitted WorkSafeBC claims. We want members to know we are here to support you and anyone who is injured on the job of any kind. Reach out to Leigh at: ohs.officer@cupe1091.ca with your incident reports. Remember if you cannot access CLEVR send an email of the incident or let your supervisor know verbally you have had an incident at work. If you cannot access CLEVR send an email to: safety@deltaschools.ca with your incident information in writing and send a copy to the union. Any way of reporting whether it is verbal, in an email or on CLEVR is reporting and an investigation must be completed.

I have been out at schools visiting with members and hearing of the shortage of EA's which has become a safety concern. The Delta School District has announced there is a \$4 Million dollar surplus in reserves and they have put a significant amount of money to Inclusive Learning for more EA's. We thanked the board for recognizing the concern and putting the money to student needs and the staff who support them. If your school needs me to come visit, I will be there just let me know!

Anyway of reporting whether it is verbal, in an email or on CLEVR is reporting and an investigation must be completed.

Days to Acknowledge in September

Hispanic Heritage Month

Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates the histories, cultures, and contributions of North American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, Central America, and South America.

National Suicide Prevention Month

National Suicide Prevention Month is dedicated to: Raising awareness about suicide prevention, reducing stigma around mental health, promoting resources, education, and open conversations and honoring survivors of suicide loss and those struggling with suicidal thoughts

Sept 1: Labour Day

Labour Day honors the contributions of workers and the labor movement. It recognizes the economic and social achievements of workers and is seen as a tribute to their efforts in building and maintaining strong, productive societies.

Sept 5: Mawlid-al-Nabi (Islamic holiday)

It marks the birthday of Prophet Muhammad, born in the year 570 CE in Mecca. Celebrated by many Muslims around the world as a time to reflect on the Prophet's life, teachings, and his role in spreading Islam.

Sept 7-13: Mennonite Heritage Week

Mennonite Heritage Week was officially designated by the Canadian Parliament in 2019 as a time to recognize and celebrate the contributions of Mennonites to Canadian society, culture, and history.

Sept 15: Internation Day of Democracy

The International Day of Democracy promotes, the importance of democratic governance, participation in civic and political life, respect for human rights, the rule of law, and the will of the people It's a day to reflect on: The state of democracy in each country. threats to democratic systems (e.g., disinformation, voter suppression, authoritarianism), efforts needed to strengthen institutions and inclusive governance

Sept 10: World Suicide Prevention Day

World Suicide Prevention Day (WSPD) was established by The International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO).

WSPD aims to: raise awareness that suicide is preventable, encourage global action to reduce suicide rates, promote mental health support, education, and de-stigmatization.

Support those affected by suicide—both survivors of attempts and those who have lost loved ones

Sept 22-28: International Week of Deaf People

It coincides with International Day of Sign Languages on September 23, which is a UN-recognized day highlighting the importance of sign languages in the full realization of human rights for Deaf people. Purpose of IWDP; promote the human rights of Deaf people around the world, raise awareness of Deaf culture, sign languages, and Deaf identity, advocate for equal access to education, employment,

healthcare, and information. Celebrate the contributions and achievements of Deaf individuals



Days to Acknowledge in September

Sept 22-24: Rosh Hashena (Jewish New Year)

Rosh Hashanah (Hebrew: "Head of the Year") is the Jewish New Year, marking the beginning of the High Holy Days or "Days of Awe", a ten-day period of reflection and repentance leading up to Yom Kippur. It's both a solemn and joyful occasion: celebrates the creation of the world. A time for introspection, prayer, and renewal

Sept 22- Oct 2: Navratri (Hindu festivals)

Navratri (Sanskrit for "Nine Nights") is a 9-night, 10-day Hindu festival dedicated to the Divine Feminine, celebrating the victory of good over evil. It honors Goddess Durga and her nine forms, collectively known as the Navadurga. It is one of the most widely celebrated festivals across India, with regional variations in traditions, rituals, and focus.

Sept 23: International Day of Sign Languages

Raising awareness about the importance of sign languages for the full realization of the human rights of Deaf people and other sign language users. Promote the preservation and promotion of sign languages worldwide. Celebrate the linguistic identity and cultural diversity of Deaf communities.

Sept 30: National Day of Truth and Reconciliation (Orange Shirt Day)

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process. This federal statutory holiday was created through legislative amendments made by Parliament.

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community intergenerational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

The Ministry of Time, by Kaliane Bradley

The Ministry of Time is a really great read: it combines romance, mystery, and a little sci-fi. The dialogue is sharp and funny, and the story is a real romp. The premise (that you learn in the first pages, I'm not ruining anything!) is that the British government has figured out time travel. As you get in to the book, you know there's more going on than meets the eye, and the author is really good at doling out information and plot twists. By the end of the book I was on the edge of my seat and couldn't put it down. This is Kaliane Bradley's first book, and I really hope she writes more. I wholeheartedly recommend!


